Labadiole-Cazenave home (1838)

Hebert House (circa 1835)

Vaughan-Bres home (1880)

Benoit Plantation remains (circa 1790)

Lockmaster House (circa 1909)

St. Delphine Plantation site

Marks settlement

Cinclare Plantation (established 1878)

Antonia Plantation home (1811)

Sandbar Plantation house (1837)

Also included:

- *Guided tour of the historic Aillet house (1830) at the West Baton Rouge Museum*
- *Reception at St. Mark's Baptist Church in Chamberlin, Louisiana (built 1867-1877)*
- *Viewing hidden, forgotten, and endangered 19th century plantation cemeteries*
- *Alma Plantation visit (home of poet, political leader and philanthropist Julien Poydras)*
- *Formal tour of the Lejeune House (circa 1800) in New Roads*
- *Lunch at Morel's Restaurant in New Roads.*
